

Standard 4(f): Uses available resources, including technologies, in the delivery of instruction.

For this criterion, I am using a web-based unit on the Roaring Twenties that I designed for my 9th grade U.S. History class. This unit demonstrates that I use technology in the delivery of instruction in my class. This unit webquest on the 1920's utilized a custom-built Google Site. Students worked with Google Forms and used many online resources to work through this self-paced unit. I used online resources such as videos and readings from <http://www.hippocampus.org/> and <http://www.archives.gov/>. Students also collaborate built a study guide and a practice test for the unit. Students also had a choice between two unit projects: building a thematic website for about changes in the 1920s, or designing a magazine cover which surveyed their research on a topic of their choice from the 1920s. I designed this whole unit from the ground-up using ideas and resources I collected from a 1-to-1 learning conference I was able to attend for professional development. This unit was experimental, and a good learning experience on how to effectively integrate the latest technology into my classroom. I hope to move my classes more in this direction in the future as I gain the time to retool my classes to meet the capabilities of the new technology my students receive from the school district. Next year, I would really like to add elements of “gamification” into this unit in order to improve it.
